## **OUR SERVICES**

**The Central Address for Senior Services** 

#### Wellness, Education, Socialization, Arts and Entertainment Programs

support the lives of our members and their families in Collier and southern Lee Counties by providing tools to address life's challenges in a safe, nurturing environment to socialize, learn and stay active.

#### **Brookdale Cognitive Health Center**

offers weekly dementia respite groups for individuals with early to mid-stage dementia focusing on language skills, memory and relaxation techniques, music and art therapy, socialization and self-esteem. Participants work with a board-certified music therapist. Caregiver Support Groups are facilitated by licensed clinical social workers for caregivers of loved ones struggling with dementia.





#### Geriatric Case Management helps

seniors combat loneliness and isolation while helping them age safely in place. A range of professional and volunteer services gives seniors the socialization and support they need to thrive.

#### Geriatric Mental Health

**Counseling** is provided by licensed clinical social workers assisting seniors and their families with challenges brought about by life transitions such as aging, cognitive decline, grief, depression and anxiety.

#### Our Food Pantry is open to anyone

experiencing a situational crisis or long-term food insecurity. With the support of community partners, donors and volunteers, shelves are stocked with nonperishable items from the Harry Chapin Food Bank, Midwest Food Bank, Collier Harvest and community donations.

## THE NEED IN OUR COMMUNITY



Research has shown that older adults who are isolated or lonely have a greater risk of dving.



These facts are impossible to ignore, which is why Baker Senior Center Naples (BSCN) offers a wide range of social and emotional support programs that enable older adults to stay active and learn while delaying the onset of chronic illnesses.

Since opening our doors in 2014, BSCN has seen a surge in the need for comprehensive services in our community for those 60 years of age and over. BSCN is able to provide a broad spectrum of support programs thanks to our nearly 300 carefully vetted and trained volunteers.

Further, our dementia respite program is the only one of its kind in Collier and southern Lee Counties. This is crucial, considering that a new case of Alzheimer's disease is diagnosed every 66 seconds in our country and 22,000 older adults are living with dementia in Naples.

This rapidly increasing need for services has resulted in a monumental growth of over 212% in our membership since moving into our new building.

## NATIONAL ACCREDITATION

## We offer so much more than an average senior center.

As one of only 111 Nationally Accredited Senior Centers, our evidence-based care is delivered by credentialed professional staff and vetted volunteers.

Our nurturing environment invites seniors to socialize, stay active and learn at their own pace, while our programs offer essential human services and enrichment for a growing senior population.

Participants in our programs often learn to manage and delay the onset of chronic disease and experience overall well-being.













## 6200 Autumn Oaks Lane A STATE-OF-THE-ART CENTER

Formerly Naples Senior Center, BSCN launched the Building Our Future capital campaign in 2019 to create a permanent home with ample room for creative programming and professional services, as well as peaceful outdoor gardens.

BSCN announced the public phase of the capital campaign at a groundbreaking ceremony on November 12, 2021. The successful capital campaign included full completion of the new facility and outdoor areas, as well as an endowment to secure the future for our community's seniors.

We opened our doors to the new 30,000-square-foot building on January 11, 2023, allowing BSCN to expand programs and services to support a growing population of older adults in our community.
